



Participate in a Research Study!

The memory laboratory in the Department of Psychology at McGill University is looking for volunteers to participate in a research project on memory. Participation involves a 1-hour online session, a 2.5 hour in-person scanning session, and a 30 minute online follow-up session. During the testing sessions, you will be asked to listen to stories or to choose between food images from everyday events, and answer questions about them while in an MRI scanner. You will receive \$20 per hour for your time and participation.

Risks: No long-term negative side effects have been observed from this type of procedure.

To participate, you must be between the ages of 18 and 35, have normal or corrected vision, and be free of any neurological condition. You must be a native English speaker (i.e., learned English before the age of 5).
